Imperial Valley Community Foundation to Manage Fund to Protect the Burrowing Owl Created by Solar Developer 8minutenergy

– Fund Will Finance a Variety of Initiatives to Conserve the Habitat of the Burrowing Owl –

EL CENTRO, CA (January 14, 2013) – The Imperial Valley Community Foundation (IVCF) today announced that it will manage the Burrowing Owl Stewardship and Education Fund recently established by 8minutenergy Renewables - a leading solar developer - in conjunction with the Sierra Club. Through a competitive grant and review process, the fund will extend financial support for initiatives designed to protect the Burrowing Owl in the Imperial Valley, Calif. The IVCF is a non-profit organization specializing in managing charitable funds and personal/corporate giving programs that benefit the Imperial Valley.

Over half of all Burrowing Owls in North America live in the Imperial Valley. The new fund represents a long-term investment in safeguarding and protecting the habitat of the Burrowing Owl in Imperial Valley. 8minutenergy and the IVCF worked closely with the Sierra Club to develop the structure of the fund. The fund will be overseen by an advisory committee composed of professional conservationists, scientists and an IVCF/Ag-community representative.

Some of the activities the fund is expected to support through grants include:

- Identifying and acquiring Burrowing Owl habitat for permanent conservation protection and enhancing such habitat
- Working with landowners and land managers to restore or enhance Burrowing Owl habitat on farmland (e.g., installing artificial burrows or other habitat enhancements)
- Creating and/or disseminating “best practices” to educate farmers, landowners and local agencies about preserving and enhancing biological resources for Burrowing Owls without negatively impacting farming operations

8minutenergy, the Sierra Club and the IVCF will encourage other renewable energy companies, as well as local residents, to make financial contributions to the fund. Those receiving grants from the fund will be encouraged to work with other organizations trying to protect the Burrowing Owl, such as the Imperial Irrigation District (IID), United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and programs related to the Burrowing Owl within the Desert Renewable Energy Conservation Plan.
